Peter R. Kalb is the Cynthia L. and Theodore S. Berenson Associate Professor of Contemporary Art, chair of the Fine Arts Department, and Women's Sexuality, and Gender Studies core faculty member at Brandeis University, where he has taught modern and contemporary art history for two decades. He is the author of "Art Since 1980: Charting the Contemporary," a chronological survey of contemporary art from its explosive beginnings in New York to its global expanse in the 21st century.

Kalb is also the author of "High Drama: The New York Cityscapes of Georgia O'Keeffe and Margaret Bourke-White" and revising author of the fifth edition of H.H. Arnason's "History of Modern Art." He has researched contemporary art in Havana, and is co-curator of the "Dreams and Realities: Visions from Taiwan and Cuba of a Post Cold-War World," a 2013 exhibition at Art Basel Hong Kong. Currently, he is writing about artists' responses to the Apollo moon landing.

Throughout the program, you will have exclusive access to Cuba's dynamic art scene, including a curator-led private tour at the National Museum of Fine Arts of Havana, home to much of Cuba's art heritage, and participate in a rehearsal at the country's leading contemporary dance company. You will also meet the workers who are fueling Cuba's economic renaissance, joining farmers on a tour of their lush tobacco hacienda in Pinar del Rio Province. A sojourn will present the opportunity to delve into the world of famed expat Ernest Hemingway, with visits to his longtime home and the village that inspired his iconic work, "The Old Man and the Sea."

Together, we will honor Cuba's Jewish community with special visits to Havana's Adath Israel Synagogue, the only Orthodox synagogue in Cuba, and the Jewish Community Center for a briefing by its president.

Dine at paladares, privately owned restaurants often found in the owner's home, in support of the Cuban people, and savor a unique "field-to-table" dining experience. Engage in stimulating conversations with fellow Brandeis travelers, local luminaries, and our tour leader, fostering a deeper understanding of Cuba's complex heritage.

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SATURDAY, FEBRUARY 22: DEPARTURE / HAVANA, CUBA

Welcome to Havana! Upon arrival at the Jose Marti International Airport, you will be greeted and transferred to La Reserva Vedado, a boutique hotel and your home for six nights. Our welcome dinner this evening is at a paladar, a privately owned restaurant located in the proprietor's home.

SUNDAY, FEBRUARY 23: HAVANA

Founded in 1519, Havana remains the Caribbean's most impressive historical urban center. Participate in a morning lecture and discussion with a local architectural historian, then depart on a walking tour of UNESCO-listed Old Havana, including four of its expansive plazas and the 18th-century Havana Cathedral, one of the oldest cathedrals in the Americas.

Visit the old Jewish Quarter, the center of Cuba's small yet fascinating Jewish community. Following lunch at a paladar, explore the homes and studios of some of Havana's leading artists, where there may be an opportunity to purchase paintings and drawings. Dinner is at El Cocinero, a former cooking oil factory transformed into a chic restaurant and bar with delicious food and world-class daiguiris.

Next door, join a curator for a private tour of what Time magazine calls one of "the world's greatest places," the Fabrica de Arte Cubano (FAC), a spellbinding, multilevel cultural, artistic, and musical performance space that defies categorization. You'll have an exclusive look at its spectacular exhibits and installations with an opportunity to purchase artwork.

MONDAY, FEBRUARY 24: HAVANA / SAN FRANCISCO DE PAULA / HAVANA

This morning, join a former ambassador and Deputy Minister for Foreign Affairs for an eye-opening discussion. Then visit Havana's Sephardic Hebrew Center. After lunch, head outside the capital to the small, hilltop village of San Francisco de Paula for a visit to Finca Vigia (Lookout Farm), the house where Ernest Hemingway lived for 20 years. View the rooms through open windows from the surrounding terraces and see Hemingway's famous fishing boat "Pilar" on the property.

Return to Havana and enjoy guided access to the Havana Art Biennial. Since its 1984 inception, this Biennial has become a cornerstone for artists from Latin America, Africa, Asia, and the Middle East, shining a light on non-Western perspectives and contemporary issues. In this highly anticipated festival, experience Havana's public spaces and lively streets transformed into open-air galleries. Meet curators and artists as you delve into extraordinary exhibitions, engaging performances, and interactive art installations.

In the early evening, explore the renowned 1930 Hotel Nacional de Cuba, designed by the acclaimed New York architecture firm McKim, Mead & White. Stop in its storied Hall of Fame to see tributes to its many famous guests, including Buster Keaton, Rita Hayworth, Nat King Cole, Sir Winston Churchill, Jean-Paul Sartre, Simone de Beauvoir, and Gabriel García Marquez. Enjoy a mojito on a terrace overlooking Havana's harbor, followed by dinner at a local paladar.

TUESDAY, FEBRUARY 25: HAVANA

Your exploration of the Havana Art Biennial continues this morning, followed by a private tour of the Museo Nacional de Bellas Artes de La Habana (National Museum of Fine Arts of Havana), Cuba's largest museum. Encounter the complex, colorful works of the country's leading modern and contemporary artists, including Raul Martinez, known as Cuba's answer to Andy Warhol; and the revered Afro-Cuban surrealist Wilfredo Lam, whose abstract, geometrical imagery was influenced by Picasso.



After lunch, visit the Jewish Community Center, El Patronato (Beth Shalom), for a briefing with the president. In the early evening, drive to The Ludwig Foundation of Cuba, one of only a few Cuban NGOs, for a presentation on Cuban art. The Foundation's President will host a cocktail reception and buffet dinner on the penthouse terrace, where guests will include local Cuban artists. Later, you may attend an evening of musical performances.

WEDNESDAY, FEBRUARY 26: HAVANA / VINALES / HAVANA

Today, venture outside Havana to the western province of Pinar del Rio, known for its lush tobacco haciendas and the Vinales Valley's UNESCO-recognized mogotes, distinctive hills towering as high as 1,000 feet, with steep, almost vertical sides. Meet with a local farmer for a private tour of a tobacco hacienda and enjoy an engaging private demonstration of the drying and rolling processes.

Transfer to lunch at a privately owned organic farm with a lovely scenic view. Before returning to Havana, visit a local artist's studio. This evening, enjoy dinner on your own. B,L

THURSDAY, FEBRUARY 27: HAVANA

Delight in a behind-the-scenes morning rehearsal of the Rosario Cardenas Dance Company, featuring some of Cuba's most gifted contemporary dancers. Afterwards, step into the 122-acre Colon Cemetery, which is more than simply a sprawling burial ground. This remarkable green space is often referred to as an open-air museum or "Cuba's largest sculpture park." With your local guide, learn the stories of Cuba's past through the elaborate sculptures, monuments, and mausoleums.


Following lunch on your own, visit the Adath Israel
Synagogue, Cuba's only Orthodox synagogue. This evening,
prepare to be moved during an exclusive performance of
Vocal Leo, an acclaimed choir, followed by a festive farewell
dinner at one of Havana's oldest paladares.
