

San José, Costa Rica

Day 2 - Wednesday, December 3rd

San José, Costa Rica

Today, visit Irazú Volcano National Park, home to Costa Rica's highest active volcano at 11,260 feet. The volcano offers breathtaking views and



a crater lake that shifts colors due to its unique mineral content. Located in the Central Volcanic Mountain Range, Irazú last erupted in 1963 during President John F. Kennedy's visit, adding to its historical significance.

Day 3 - Thursday, December 4th

San José, Costa Rica

Begin your city tour of San José with a visit to the Teatro Nacional Costa Rica, an architectural gem. Marvel at its opulent interiors and learn about its rich history. Next, we'll explore the Gold Museum and delve into Costa Rica's indigenous history through an impressive collection of artifacts. Enjoy lunch in the center of San José, with some time to soak in the cultural treasures of the Costa Rican capital.

Day 4 - Friday, December 5th

Parque Nacional Volcán Poás

Today, we'll visit Hacienda Doka, where you'll immerse yourself in the fascinating world of Costa Rican coffee. This historic coffee plantation offers a behind-the-scenes look at the coffee production process, from cultivating the seedlings in the nursery to the intricate methods used at the Heritage Processing Plant, which still operates with machinery dating back to the 19th century. Conclude your visit with a guided tasting of eight unique coffee blends, exploring the rich flavors and aromas in the plantation's gift shop. Experience the breathtaking Poás Volcano National Park. One of Costa Rica's most iconic attractions, Poás Volcano, boasts one of the largest active craters in the world. Just a short hike away lies the Botos Lagoon, a serene, rain-fed lake nestled within an extinct crater. Surrounded by lush cloud forests, the lagoon provides a tranquil contrast to the volcano's activity. Our adventure continues at the La Paz Waterfall Gardens, a verdant sanctuary of natural beauty. Stroll through vibrant botanical gardens filled with tropical flowers, including orchids and heliconias. Marvel at the cascading waterfalls, such as the towering La Paz Falls, which provide stunning photo opportunities. Along the way, encounter Costa Rica's incredible wildlife in the park's exhibits, featuring colorful butterflies, playful monkeys, hummingbirds, big cats, and other native species. This experience offers an up-close connection to the country's remarkable biodiversity.

Day 5 - Saturday, December 6th

Monteverde

This morning, enjoy a scenic drive to Monteverde. Our first stop will be lunch at a local non-profit artisan cooperative dedicated to enhancing local women artists' economic and social well-being. We'll have a chance to converse with the artists and view their work. After lunch, we'll visit the Monteverde Cloud Forest Biological Reserve, one of the world's most famous reserves and essential in Costa Rica due to its conservation activities and scientific research. Founded in 1972 and covering an area of 3,500 hectares, the Monteverde Reserve has 2.5% of the world's biodiversity. The reserve's geographical, topographical, and climatic conditions have favored its surprising biodiversity. In its forests, we find four "Ecological Life Zones," which give life to different ecosystems inhabited by hundreds of species of mammals, birds, butterflies, amphibians, reptiles, insects, and arachnids, as well as a great variety of plants such as mosses, lianas, and common trees of the cloud forest.

Day 6 - Sunday, December 7th

Monteverde/Arenal Area

Start your day with a sweet chocolate and sugar cane tour! Participate in the chocolate process, tasting and learning about each stage. Next, visit the sugar cane mill to discover the origin of sugar cane, see the plantation, and learn about the

production of sugar cane products. You'll even get the chance to extract fresh, sweet sugar cane juice. Later, enjoy stunning views as we arrive in the Arenal area.

Arenal Area/San José, Costa Rica
This morning we'll explore the Arenal's Mistico
hanging bridges. This enchanting park features a
series of suspension bridges and well-maintained
trails that wind through the vibrant canopy,
providing visitors with unique vantage points to
experience the region's rich biodiversity. Later this
afternoon, we'll return to San José, where tonight
we gather for a festive farewell dinner.


