Linking the two fascinating capital cities, the Elbe River traverses a land filled with captivating treasures including cosmopolitan cities and picturesque towns; terraced vineyards and lush orchards; fortress-crowned crags and spectacular gorges.

Begin in Berlin with an overnight stay at the iconic, centrally located Adlon Kempinski. After a city center tour and landmark sites, you'll embark on the M/S *Elbe River Princesse* for eight nights. In Berlin, visit the Brandenburg Gate, Checkpoint Charlie, the Holocaust Memorial and the Jewish Museum.

En route to Potsdam, visit the Holocaust study center at Wansee House, and upon arrival, explore the whimsical Sanssouci Palace and gardens, the summer residence of Frederick the Great, and in Wittenberg, the city of the Reformation, tour the Castle Church where Martin Luther posted his 95 Theses. Admire the treasures of Meissen's fine porcelain factory, then continue to Dresden where you will see the Theater Square, the Old and New Synagogues, the Church of Our Lady, and the Green Vault.

Before crossing the border into Czechia, enjoy an afternoon excursion to Saxon Switzerland National Park, which boasts magnificent views of the Elbe River. Spend the next morning in the royal town of Litomerice, one of the oldest Bohemian cities and a designated UNESCO World Heritage Site. Conclude your journey with a tour of Jewish Prague, with visits to the Altneu and Klausen Synagogues. Enjoy a private lunch with musical entertainment at Lobkowicz Palace.

In partnership with local guides and experts, Antony Polonsky, Professor Emeritus of Holocaust Studies, will enrich and inform the journey by sharing his insights and expertise in the Jewish history and heritage of the countries you'll visit from Berlin to Prague.

ANTONY POLONSKY is Emeritus

Professor of Holocaust Studies at Brandeis University and Chief Historian of the Global **Education Outreach Project at the POLIN** Museum of the History of Polish Jews in Warsaw. He is co-chair of the editorial board of "Polin: Studies in Polish Jewry; author of Politics in Independent Poland" (1972), "The Little Dictators" (1975), "The Great Powers and the Polish Question" (1976); co-author of "A History of Modern Poland" (1980) and "The Beginnings of Communist Rule in Poland" (1981); and co-editor of "Contemporary Jewish writing in Poland: an anthology" (2001) and "The Neighbors Respond: the Controversy over the Jedwabne Massacre in Poland" (2004).

His most recent work is "The Jews in Poland and Russia" (Oxford, 2010, 2012), published in three volumes and in an abridged edition as "The Jews in Poland and Russia. A Short History" (2014), which has been translated into French, Polish and Lithuanian. In 1999, he was awarded the Knight's Cross of the Order of Merit of the Republic of Poland and the Officer's Cross

of the Order of Merit of Independent Lithuania. He holds honorary doctorates from the University of Warsaw (2010), the Jagiellonian University (2014) and the Polish University Abroad (Polski Uniwersytet na Obczyźnie) (2022).

Friday-Saturday, May 2-3 BERLIN

Depart the U.S. on an overnight flight to Berlin, Germany. Upon arrival, transfer to the Adlon Kempinski and enjoy time at leisure this afternoon. Take an optional late afternoon walking tour of Berlin, which includes Brandenburg Gate and Peter Eisenman's Holocaust Memorial. Gather for a welcome reception this evening. ADLON KEMPINSKI (R)

Sunday, May 4 BERLIN

This morning view the masterpieces on display at Alte Nationalgalerie on Museum Island followed by an afternoon visit to the Jewish Museum. Later this afternoon, embark *Elbe Princesse*.

Monday, May 5 BERLIN/POTSDAM

Enjoy a specially arranged visit at Pestalozzi Street Synagogue, then continue to the Holocaust study center at Wansee House. In Potsdam, visit Sanssouci Palace before reembarking the ship late evening.

ELBE PRINCESSE (B,L,D)

Tuesday, May 6 CRUISING/ MAGDEBURG

Delight in the educational program this morning as the Elbe Princesse cruises to Magdeburg, one of the oldest cities in Germany. Upon arrival, visit the Magdeburg Cathedral, the country's oldest Gothic construction, the New Synagogue, and the Green Citadel. Here see how the architect's environmental ethics influenced its abundance of vegetation. There will also be an opportunity to join an optional e-bike tour of Magdeburg (at an additional cost). ELBE PRINCESSE (B,L,D)

Wednesday, May 7 WITTENBERG/CRUISING

Spend the morning in Wittenburg, the city of Reformation. Tour the Castle Church, where Martin Luther posted his 95 theses in 1517, and the Luther House before returning to the ship for lunch and an afternoon of cruising. ELBE PRINCESSE (B,L,D)

Thursday, May 8 MEISSEN/DRESDEN

Visit Europe's oldest porcelain factory, then continue by coach to Dresden for a private lunch of regional specialties. Next take a guided tour of Dresden including Opera Square, the Old/New Synagogue, Church of Our Lady, and Green Vault treasures. The remainder of the day and evening are free to explore Dresden independently.

ELBE PRINCESSE (B,L,D)

Friday, May 9 BAD SCHANDAU/ CRUISING

This morning enjoy an excursion to Saxon Switzerland National Park. Walk along the German part of the Sandstone Mountains with free time to walk at Bastei, with its distinctive rock formations and panoramic views over the mighty Elbe River. Embark Elbe Princesse and resume cruising as the ship crosses the border into the Czech Republic. ELBE PRINCESSE (B,L,D)

Saturday, May 10 LITOMERICE, CZECH REPUBLIC/ CRUISING

Spend the morning in Litomerice, a royal town established in the 13th century and one of the oldest Bohemian cities. This UNESCO World Heritage Site was also home to a Jewish population in the



16th century. There will also be an optional visit to Terezin, once a ghetto and concentration camp during World War II. Cruise the rest of the afternoon with time for a lecture.

ELBE PRINCESSE (B,L,D)

Sunday, May 11 PRAGUE

Disembark outside of Prague and drive to the city for an engaging walking tour of Jewish Prague. Visit Prague's fabled Alt-Neu Synagogue, the oldest functioning Jewish house of worship in Europe, and the Klausen Synagogues that presently serve as exhibition halls for the lewish Museum. At Lobkowicz Palace, enjoy lunch with a musical performance. This afternoon there is an option for time at leisure or for a guided visit through Prague's Old Town. Return to the Elbe Princesse for a reception and final dinner on board.

After breakfast disembark and transfer to the airport for flights home or join the post-trip extension in Prague. (B)

In some instances, elevators are unavailable, and stairs may not have handrails. Participants must be physically fit, active, and in good health. All participants will be required to follow safety protocols set forth by Brandeis Travelers or Criterion Travel, our tour operator; local staff; and host country laws.








LAUNCHED IN APRIL 2016, the *Elbe Princesse* is ideally suited for voyages along the Vltava and Elbe Rivers and the Havel Canal. The vessel is powered by two side-mounted paddlewheels, allowing for an ultra-shallow draft of barely three feet, thus avoiding the issue of low water levels on the rivers. Each of the comfortable outward-facing cabins features either large non-opening picture windows on the Main Deck (*Pont Principal*), or a sliding glass door with floor-to-ceiling windows on the Upper Deck (*Pont Supérieur*). The vessel combines contemporary comfort and modern, sleek design with state-of-theart marine technology. The public areas are elegantly decorated, with panoramic windows allowing you to relax and enjoy the passing scenery. There is also a spacious sun deck with comfortable deck furniture. With a low crew member to passenger ratio, personal attention is assured throughout the voyage.
