Begin with two nights in Auckland, the vibrant "City of Sails," featuring an excursion to the wildlife-rich Tiritiri Matangi Island sanctuary. Then travel to Rotorua, where you'll walk the surreal geothermal trails of Waiotapu, soak in thermal pools beneath UNESCO-designated dark skies, and enjoy an immersive cultural day with members of the Ngāti Manawa tribe.

Next, fly to the South Island and traverse the stunning Canterbury Plains to Lake Tekapo, known for its turquoise waters and pristine night skies. Continue to Aoraki/Mount Cook National Park to admire the mighty Tasman Glacier. Enjoy sampling award-winning pinot noir at Kinross Winery in the scenic Gibbston Valley, and continue to Queenstown, the country's adventure capital.

Spend two nights at the tranquil Lake Te Anau and explore the dramatic, glacier-carved wilderness of Fiordland National Park. Highlights include a guided walk along the famed Milford Track and a scenic cruise on Milford Sound. Conclude with a final night in Queenstown.

In partnership with local guides and experts, our tour will be led by Dan L. Perlman, Professor of Environmental Studies at Brandeis, who will enrich and inform the journey with his deep knowledge of animal behavior, conservation biology, environmental studies, and ecology.

Walk a section of the Milford Track, described as "the Finest Walk in the World," before a scenic cruise in Milford Sound surrounded by towering cliffs and cascading waterfalls.

Soak in geothermal waters while stargazing beneath the southern night sky in New Zealand's only UNESCO Dark Sky Reserve.

Immerse in Māori culture during a special day with members of the Ngati Manawa Tribe, and walk the trails of Waiotapu, a colorful geothermal wonderland.

Spend the day on Tiritiri Matangi Island, a wildlife sanctuary and conservation success story brimming with wildlife rarely seen on the mainland.

Venture into Mount Cook National Park home to the highest mountains and longest glaciers in New Zealand and a playground for legendary mountaineers, including Sir Edmund Hillary.

Sample award-winning wines at Kinross Winery, nestled in the heart of Gibbston Valley, New Zealand's premier wine region.

Experience the wild beauty of Fiordland National Park on a journey along the Waiau River to Lake Manapouri aboard a privately chartered jet boat.

Brandeis Faculty Leader: Dan L. Perlman



Dan L. Perlman is Professor of Environmental Studies at Brandeis, where he has taught a wide range of courses, including ecology, conservation biology, animal behavior, and introductory Environmental Studies. During his tenure, he has served as associate provost of innovation in education and director of the Center for Teaching and Learning. Professor Perlman has co-authored three textbooks on conservation biology and ecology: "Conserving Earth's Biodiversity: With E.O. Wilson," "Practical Ecology for Planners, Developers, and Citizens," and "Biodiversity: Exploring Values and Priorities in Conservation." He developed the website EcoLibrary.org, where he freely distributes his teaching materials for ecology and environmental studies. He received his B.A. from Yale, and Ph.D. from Harvard. Professor Perlman has led numerous Brandeis Travelers trips to Alaska, the Galapagos Islands, the Amazon, the Canadian Rockies, and Kenya.





ITINERARY:

Sunday-Tuesday, February 15-17 Home/Auckland, New Zealand

Depart home on an overnight flight to Auckland, located on New Zealand's North Island and affectionately nicknamed the "City of Sails." Lose one day crossing the international dateline. Auckland is a vibrant cosmopolitan city with a busy nightlife, world-class restaurants, bush-clad mountain ranges, and diverse neighborhoods. Upon arrival, transfer to the MSocial Hotel located downtown on the waterfront. This afternoon, take an optional guided walking tour of the inner city. Gather this evening for a welcome orientation and introductory lecture at the hotel, followed by dinner on the waterfront. MSocial Hotel (D)

Wednesday, February 18 Auckland (Tiritiri Matangi)

Following breakfast board a morning ferry for an 80-minute cruise through Tikapa Moana/Hauraki Gulf to the island sanctuary, Tiritiri Matangi. Explore this wildlife sanctuary and community-based conservation success story during guided walks, with chances to see rare and endangered bird species in a pristine, predator-free envi-

ronment. Enjoy a picnic lunch on the island before returning to Auckland by ferry in the late afternoon. This evening is free to dine at one of Auckland's excellent restaurants and to experience the city firsthand. MSocial Hotel (B,L)

Thursday, February 19 Auckland/Waitomo/ Rotorua

Travel south through the southern suburbs of Auckland, over the Bombay Hills, and through the lush Waikato Valley to Waitomo. The Waitomo region is renowned for its distinctive limestone landscape and underground cave systems. Depart on a guided tour into the Ruakuri Cave and gently descend a large spiral walkway to the bottom of the cave. Pass through the specially constructed Drum Entrance tunnel and into the cave, journeying down to the softly folding shawl-like limestone formations and crystal tapestries. Hear the distant thunder of the subterranean waterfalls and observe the cavern glow-worms carefully. From Waitomo, travel across the bush-clad Mamaku Ranges to Rotorua, in the heart of New Zealand's famous thermal region. Check into the Pullman Rotorua hotel situated on the banks of Lake Rotorua and dine at a local restaurant in Auckland. Pullman Rotorua (B,L,D)

Friday, February 20 Rotorua

Venture to the picturesque town of Murupara for an immersive Māori cultural experi-

ence with the Ngati Manawa Tribe. Begin with a special powhiri (welcome) ceremony including tea with elders from the tribe in their marae, traditional meeting house. Learn about the tribe's history and traditions and see the oldest Māori rock carvings in New Zealand. After a traditional hangi lunch, return to Rotorua, stopping enroute at the one of the world's most colorful geothermal areas, Waiotapu. Here find the Artist's Palette, where different minerals from areas on the pool surface, view the tiny bubbles surfacing in the Champagne Pool, and walk down alongside the silica terrace to see the Bridal Veil Falls. Return to the hotel where the remainder of the day is at leisure with the option to soak in the nearby Polynesian Spa. There will also be an option to join a short walk to Rotorua's lively "Eat Streat," for dinner at one of the many Kiwi-inspired restaurants lining both sides of the street. Pullman Rotorua

Saturday, February 21 Rotorua/Christchurch/ Lake Tekapo

Following a morning lecture, visit the Redwood Forest for a short walk on the Redwood Memorial Grove, dedicated to the memory of the New Zealand Forest Service. On this popular trail meander through breathtaking Sequoia sempervirens planted at the turn of the 20th century. Standing over 200 feet tall, these trees create a wonderful shelter for a diverse range of native plants and birds. Following an early lunch, transfer to the Rotorua airport for the short, direct flight to Christchurch, on New Zealand's South Island. Upon arrival, travel to the shores of the glacier-fed Lake Tekapo, a remarkable, turquoise-colored lake surrounded by the mountainous drama of the Southern Alps. This evening visit the home of Tekapo locals and farming experts, Angie and Stan Taylor, who will share their secrets of making pavlova. New Zealand's national dessert, followed by a hosted dinner. Peppers Bluewater Resort Tekapo (B,L,D)

Sunday, February 22 Aoraki/Mount Cook National Park

Today experience a full day in Aoraki/Mount Cook National Park, home of the highest mountains and the longest glaciers in New Zealand, and an alpine landscape in the purest sense - with skyscraping peaks, glaciers, and permanent snow fields. Join a guided walk on the Hooker Valley Track, affording incredible views to Hooker Lake and back. In Mount Cook Village visit the Sir Edmund Hillary Center, a tribute to one of the world's greatest mountaineers. For an additional fee, witness the spectacular Tasman Glacier from a ski plane. Return to Lake Tekapo for dinner at leisure, and later soak in hot mineral pools while learning about the night skies above. Picturesque by day and daz-



zling by night, Lake Tekapo is part of a UNESCO Dark Sky Reserve, making it an ideal site for stargazing. Peppers Bluewater Resort Tekapo (B,L)

Monday, February 23 Lake Tekapo/Gibbston Valley/Queenstown

The educational program continues before traveling to Queenstown by way of Gibbston Valley, the "Land of the Vines," and the most famous wine region in New Zealand. Enjoy lunch and wine tasting at the award-winning Kinross Winery, elevated in 2024 to the short list of top restaurants in the South Island. Continue to Queenstown, New Zealand's "Adventure Capital," set against the remarkable Lake Wakatipu. Take a guided walking tour of the Botanical Gardens before checking in to the Novotel Queenstown Lakeside Hotel, ideally situated in the heart of the city. The evening is free to dine at one of the delicious restaurants in town, including the famed Ferburgers. Novotel Lakeside Queenstown (B,L)

Tuesday, February 24 Queenstown/Te Anau

Depart Queenstown this morning and journey along the eastern shores of Lake Wakatipu to the lovely Southland countryside where sheep, cattle, and deer farming predominate. Stop at a former sheep farm turned dairy for a visit, where the owner will share his expertise and host lunch in his private home.

Continue to Te Anau, the base for the glacier-carved wilderness of Fiordland National Park, Embark on a lakefront Fiordland Jet Pure Wilderness experience in Te Anau. Cruise the quiet waters of the Waiau River to the deserted shores of Lake Manapouri, one of New Zealand's most beautiful lakes. Disembark to wander the native bush beyond the beach. and learn about local flora and fauna at the UNESCO Biosphere Reserve. Cruise back to Te Anau and check in to the Distinction Luxmore, conveniently located in the heart of downtown. Savor dinner together at a local restaurant in town. Distinction Luxmore Hotel Lake Te Anau (B.L.D)

Wednesday, February 25 Milford Track & Milford Sound

Begin with an early morning two-hour scenic drive to Milford Sound. Take a short water taxi to Sandfly Point on the Milford Track. Meander alongside the cascading Arthur River through a lush rainforest to Giant Gate Waterfall. Next view Milford Sound's awe-inspiring scenery by boat, cruising the full length of the fiord. Relax while admiring the grandeur of Mitre Peak with its mountains and endemic wildlife. Return to Te Anau in the early evening with dinner upon arrival at the hotel. Distinction Luxmore Hotel Lake Te Anau (B,L)

Thursday, February 26 Te Anau/Queenstown

Following the final lecture of the program, return to Queenstown and check in to the Crowne Plaza Queenstown Hotel, offering superb panoramic views of Lake Wakatipu. This afternoon tour Queenstown independently. Gather for a festive farewell dinner in one of Queenstown's top restaurants to celebrate the journey. Crowne Plaza Queenstown (B,D)

Friday, February 27 Queenstown/Home

Following breakfast, join group transfers to Queenstown airport this morning and board connecting flights home. (B)

WHAT TO EXPECT:

This is a moderately strenuous program that is at times both physically demanding and busy and requires participants to be in good health and able to keep up with the group without assistance from tour staff. Some of the walking will take place over uneven and unpaved terrain, on muddy or sandy trails, and on moderate inclines/declines. Some historic buildings do not have elevators, and you'll sometimes encounter steps without handrails. Sturdy, well-fitting, waterproof, broken-in hiking boots with ankle support are essential.

Travel on land will be by modern, air-conditioned motorcoach on roads ranging from modern highways to winding mountainous roads in remote locations. Long drives will be broken up with rest stops and site visits. In addition, there will be an on-tour flight from Rotorua to Christchurch on February 21st, enabling us to travel quickly and comfortably from the North Island to the South Island. Busy days will be offset with opportunities to explore independently and relax at the hotels.

Note: This tour is not recommended for guests with neurological conditions that affect stability, mobility, and decision making. It is also not suitable for those with recent knee injuries, recent surgery, moderate to severe joint issues and moderate to severe heart conditions. Finally, this tour is not suitable for those who may wish to physically extend themselves by going further or faster than the average person, or for those who are not interested in participating in a group activity.
